Half of the 60 credits (30 credits) must be devoted to practice. Specific teacher training replaces academic initial teacher training, academic level initial teacher training and the certificate of teaching proficiency. Specific teacher training is offered by universities, university colleges and centres for adult education. The diploma is a teaching degree and has the same value in the three institutions that organise this training.

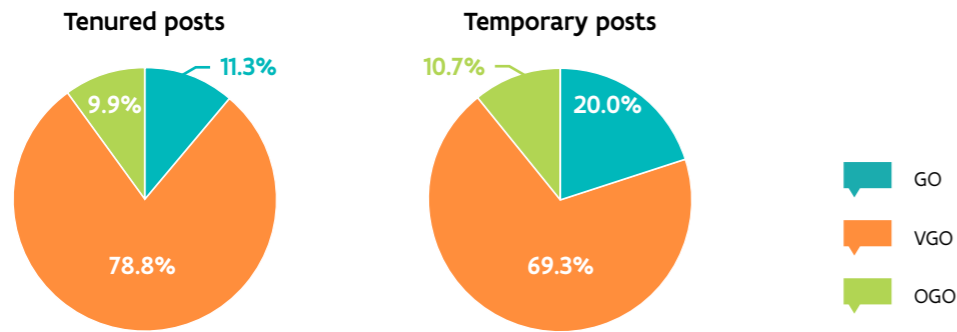

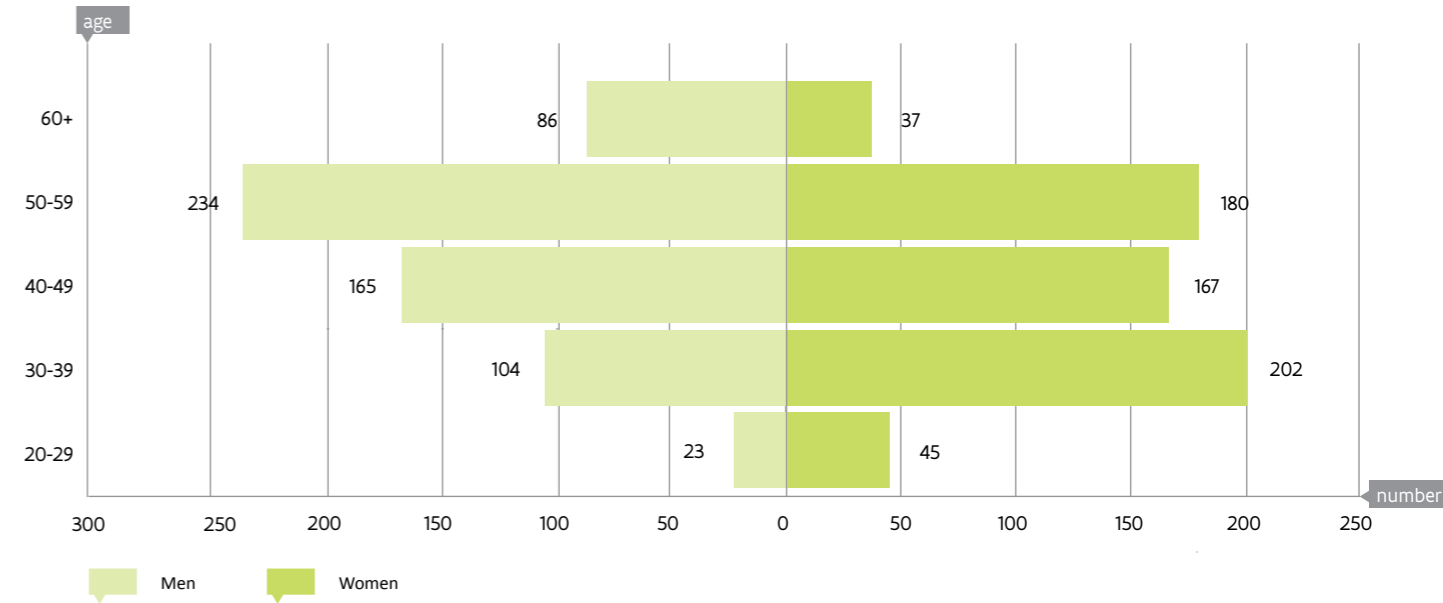
3 Staff in associate degree nursing by legal status (full-time equivalents)

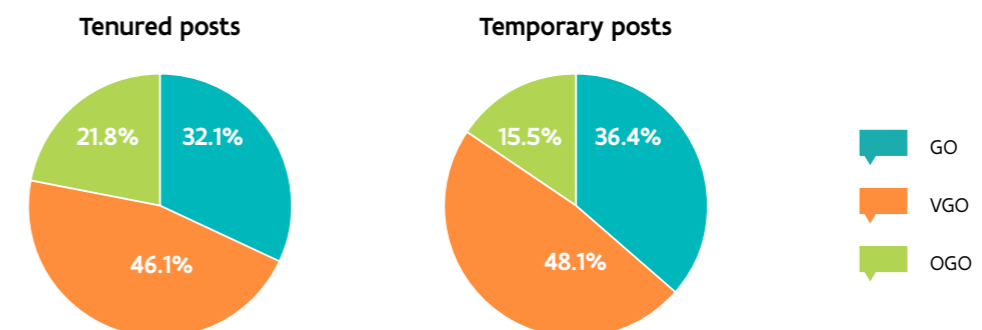
5 Staff in higher vocational adult education and specific teacher training by age group and gender

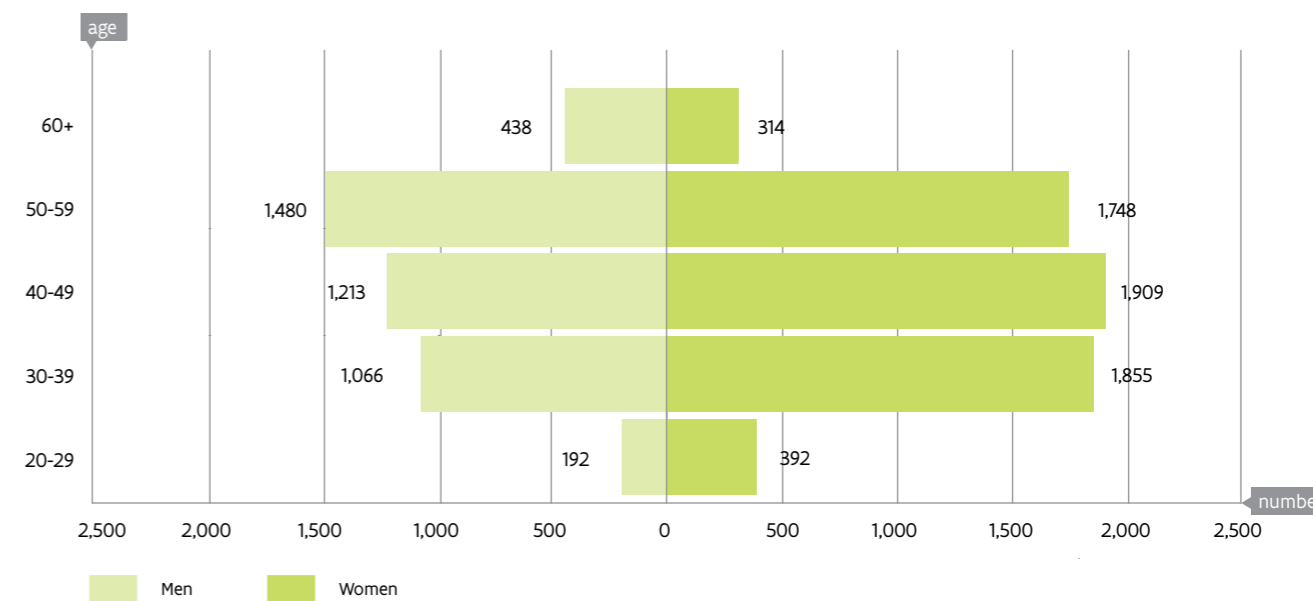

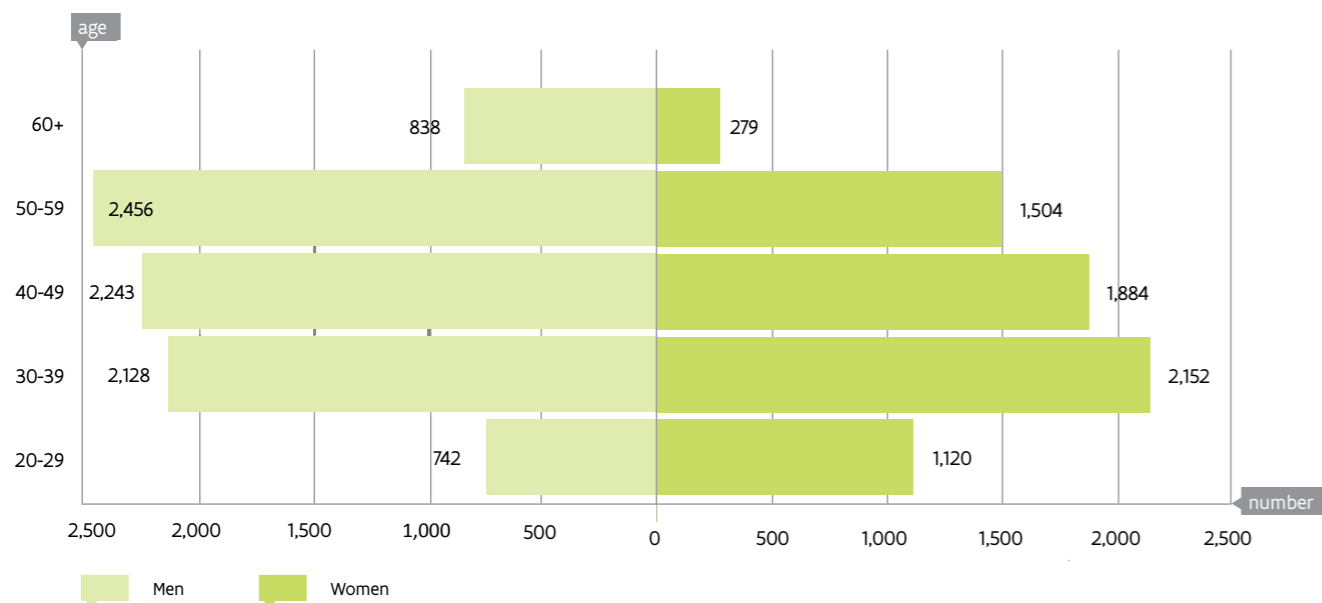

Authorisations are budgetary engagements allocated to AHOVOKS in the Flemish budget and on the basis of which AHOVOKS can enter into agreements on infrastructure projects. The investment resources granted to the research universities are also paid for by AHOVOKS by means of quarterly payments.

In fiscal year 2015 an amount of 5,000,000 euro was allocated to the university colleges to partially eliminate the historical outstanding balance. In fiscal year 2015 a budget of 787,000 euro is provided for the owner maintenance of the autonomous university colleges. This budget is managed by AHOVOKS.
