Tip

It's convenient to activate a variety of digital keys. This means you'll always have one handy, even if you don't have your eID close by.

You can activate your own digital keys on csam.be/myprofile.



Security code via text message (SMS)

Some online government services are accessible using a code received by SMS. This code may be used once allowing you to sign in. You will not be charged for the SMS. Your user name and password will also be required for this key.



Security code via mobile app

There are various mobile apps to generate a unique, time-related security code with which you can sign in. These can be downloaded for free on your tablet or smartphone. Your user name and password will also be required for this key.



Security code via e-mail

Some online government services can be accessed with a code sent to you via email. You can use this code once to sign in. You will also need your user name and password for this key.

Signing in with an eID and connected card reader or with itsme®

Signing in with your eID, your PIN code and a connected eID card reader or signing in with itsme® offer you the highest level of security. These are therefore the default ways to sign in. You can only activate other digital keys after first signing in with your eID or itsme®.

Tip

Still need a card reader? You can find one in most supermarkets or multimedia stores. They are not expensive.

You can also often go to the library or town hall to register with a card reader there.



How to activate your itsme®

First download the app to your smartphone from the App Store. Then link your identity details once to your itsme® account via your bank card or your eID.

User name and password



You will need to give a user name and password the first time you register with "My digital keys". These will immediately create a new digital key that is sometimes required in combination with another key.

What are digital keys?

Many online government services require a digital key to gain access. Compare it to a locked house.

This also requires a key to enter. There are various types of digital keys. You can choose the type you prefer. Please note: each online service determines the selection of keys that can be chosen for access. This means that not all digital keys can be used for all online government services.

Why are online government services protected?

If we are to provide you with appropriate information, the online counters need to know who you are. This prevents someone else being able to view your information or doing something in your name without your permission.

Do you already have a digital key?

Did you know that everyone in Belgium already has a digital key for which no activation is required?

Indeed, we all have an eID. Be sure to keep track of the PIN code of your eID. It is just as important as the PIN code for your bank card.
